#### **Dear Puffin Room Families.**

Our field trip to the Desert Museum will be on March 4<sup>th</sup>. Students are asking if family members can join them on the field trip. As I stated before the break, you must have the paperwork turned into the district and willing to chaperone to go with the class. We have already turned in the paperwork. If you really want to go I can try to get you on the paperwork. I only heard back from one parent. TUSD has very strict rules about who can join students on field trips. All parents who want to go on the field trip to chaperone must fill out a volunteer form on the TUSD website. If you do not fill out the form, then you may not join the class on the bus or chaperone students. This applies to all other family members also. Parents may go separately and tour with their child, but they will not be able to take other students with them away from their assigned chaperone. This means that if your child wants to be with you and their friends, you will have to stay with the group that the friend is assigned to. Other family members who decide to go separately without

filling out the form need to know that they may not take the child away from the group. Finally, if you go separately, you will have to pay full price to get into the Museum.

Finally, the cost of the field trip is \$4 per student and \$12 if you are chaperoning. Attached to this packet is an envelope that you can send the \$4 in. If you can and would like to donate \$1 to support another student, you can send it with the \$4. If you cannot afford it, please let me know.
